

Commonly known as Dr. Maggie Kigozi, is a Ugandan medical doctor, business consultant, university chancellor and sportswoman. Currently, she works as a consultant at United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO).

Her father was of Irish descent and her mother traces her roots to Masaka District in Central Uganda. Her father and siblings were champion motorcycle riders in Uganda and East Africa in the 1960s and 1970s. Margaret herself is an avid motorcycle rider.

she migrated to Zambia in Southern Africa, where she practiced as a physician, from 1977 until 1979 then she continued to practice medicine in Kenya until 1986. She returned to Uganda and worked as the physician to members of the Parliament of Uganda and their families, from 1986 until 1994. She has been reported to have had a passion for pediatrics during her medical career.

In 1994 she joined Crown Bottlers Uganda Limited, as the Marketing Director. During her tenure at Crown Bottlers, she was appointed Board Member of Uganda Manufacturers Association. She worked at the bottling company until she was appointed Executive Director at Uganda Investment Authority (UIA) in 1999 until 2011. She is the first person and first woman to serve in that position at UIA.
